





# Proposition A

**The Board of Supervisors controls the MTA Board without voter input.**

The MTA Board is not elected — it's made up of political appointees chosen by the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors has control of who is and isn't on the MTA Board, not voters. Proposition A will give control of Muni to the MTA Board, leaving San Francisco voters without a say in their public transportation system.

More money, less accountability and more power for the Board of Supervisors?
